

The June 21, 2017, Board of Directors meeting of the Kiwanis Club of Bremerton was held at the United Way Office, Bremerton.

Members present included President Darroll Clark, Stephanie Blotzer, Bill Enger, Bobby Gross, Justin Ksen, Bob Morgan, Patti Peterson, Roy Rainey and Rob Schneidler. Beverley Lucky-Short attended as a guest.

Noting a quorum was present, President Darroll Clark called the meeting to order at 6:16 pm.

Secretary's Report:

Minutes from the May 17, 2017, Board of Directors Meeting were approved as presented. The May monthly report to Kiwanis International was reviewed and accepted.

Treasurer's Report:

Rob presented the Treasurer's reports which were accepted. Tim Lavin will transfer \$51.00 from the Administrative Account to the Project Account. This is for a recent contribution to the PNW Kiwanis Scholarship Fund, which had been mis-allocated.

Committee Reports:

Darroll will contact the Bremerton School District to investigate the possibility of establishing a recognition program for outstanding employees.

In a previous Board Meeting, we approved a \$100 expenditure for a Key club member to attend Girls State. The money was not needed so the check was not written.

Advisor Deann Irish reported, through Darroll, the Key Club was interested in selling air fresheners as a fund raiser. After discussion, a motion was passed that we would spent \$705 to purchase these items and would not expect reimbursement.

Patti Peterson has expressed interest in attending the District Convention August 24 - 27, 2017, in the Tri-Cities. A motion was approved to cover her expenses at that event.

Roger Zegers will conduct a review of our financial records.

Patti's fund raising project to raffle off a ukulele was approved. 250 tickets will be printed priced at \$10 each.

Brandi Short has volunteered to be our club advisor at the Bremerton Middle School Builders Club.

As the Admiral Theatre will undergo some renovation in August, the Source Room will not be available for our meetings on the 10th and 17th. We will meet at the downtown Bremerton Library on the 10th and the 17th at the Kiwanis annual picnic to be held at the Zegers' residence.

400 pies will be ordered for the Blackberry Festival.

A Back to School Wonderwear Project was approved with collection to take place at Wal-Mart on July 22, 2017. Key Club members are approved to assist with this project.

Meeting adjourned.
